RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, bear populations onthe Fort Apache Indian Reservation have been increasing during the past several years, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to protect livestock against bear depredations and at the same time, provide as much sport hunting for bear as is possible, and
- WHEREAS, an agreement has been reached with the Arizona Game Commission to extend the 1969 spring bear season and thereby effect a greater harvest.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the existing bear hunt regulations be amended to read "Season Dates: April 12, 1969 May 31, 1969 inclusive."

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
