RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to provide quality fishing and derive the maximum revenue from permit holders, and
- WHEREAS, Sush-Bezazhe Lake (Little Bear) has been planted with brown trout and is located in such a manner that all access can be controlled, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors and the Fishery Management Biologist have recommended that this lake be managed on a lure-only basis for a period of one year, beginning April 1, 1969.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Sush-Bezazhe Lake (Little Bear) be designated as a lureonly fishery for a one year period beginning April 1, 1969.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a full report of this experimental project be presented to the Tribal Council for further evaluation in June, 1970.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
