RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Resolution No. 68-35, 1968-69 Tribal Budget, appropriated \$9,000.00 for the Relief of Indigent Tribal Members, and
- WHEREAS, Bureau of Indian Affairs funds are available for emergency purposes to care for indigent tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, there is a need for a Case Worker in the Branch of Social Services, Fort Apache Agency, to assist in processing applications for Child Welfare, General Assistance Grants, etc., and
- WHEREAS, there are savings in Section III Welfare of the Tribal Budget, sufficient to cover the salary and expenses of such a position.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the funds remaining in Section III, Account No. 11-7917, Relief to Indigent Tribal Members, be used to establish a position of Case Worker in the Branch of Social Services, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said position will be under the technical and administrative supervision of the Supervisory Social Worker, Fort Apache Agency, with a starting salary of \$5,700.00 per annum with an increase to \$6,000.00 per annum after the incumbent has successfully completed a six-month probationary period.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the incumbent shall be reimbursed for travel expenses on the same basis as other employees of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the incumbent shall be entitled to receive such other benefits as are available to other employees of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on March 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
