## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Bureau of Indian Affairs has constructed a new Bureau School at Cedar Creek on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Branch of Roads has programmed the construction and paying of an access road to and from the said school, and
- WHEREAS, the construction of the road is necessary for the proper administration of the school.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted a gratuitous right of way approximately 0.5 miles in length and 60 feet in width pursuant to the map of said right of way on file in the Superintendent's Office, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent determine the necessary fencing along said route and construct same and further that the Bureau be required to reconstruct any fencing that may be removed by the construction of said road.

The foregoing resolution was on March 5, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
