

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is constructing several road projects in the vicinity of Whiteriver on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, gravel for base and paving is needed by the Branch of Roads to complete said projects, and

WHEREAS, suitable material has been located in the river bottom south of Bourke Ranch as shown on the accompanying map, and

WHEREAS, said roads will be of much benefit to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted permission to remove gravel by contract or otherwise and that damages and royalties be hereby waived in lieu of benefits received.

The foregoing resolution was on May 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
