## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 66-20 of the White Mountain Apache Tribe delineated a Primitive Area of 7,400 acres including Mount Baldy for a five year period ending December 31, 1970, and
- WHEREAS, said resolution prohibits development or timber cutting and vehicular traffic, with the exception of fire control traffic, and
- WHEREAS, an infestation of Spruce Bark Beetle has been found due east of Mount Baldy which may require immediate cutting and burning of bark and slash to prevent spread of said beetle infestation to other standing live trees within the Primitive Area and the adjoining Primitive Area on the Apache National Forest.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Resolution No. 66-20 be amended to permit cutting of infested trees and burning of bark and slash from said trees whenever such infestations pose a threat of spread to other standing green trees within the Primitive Area.

The foregoing resolution was on May 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
