RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe needing Nursing Home Care now have to enter facilities in Phoenix or Tucson, and
- WHEREAS, there appears to be a continuing and increasing need for Nursing Home placements, it is believed that it would be to the benefit of the Indian people living on this Reservation to have a Nursing Home located on the Reservation and owned and operated by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council requests that a Feasibility Study be completed jointly by the Tribe, the Public Health Service and the Bureau of Indian Affairs; this Study to ascertain the need and financial feasibility of a tribally owned and operated Nursing Home on the Fort Apache Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all documents, information, and the completed Study are to be channelled through the Chairman of the Tribal Health Education and Welfare Committee, with final approval and authorization by the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Anended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
