RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, fishing in Hawley Lake has been very poor for the past two or three years due to presence of California Golden Shiners, and
- WHEREAS, the Fish and Wildlife Service, Tribal and Bureau of Indian Affairs Technicians have recommended draining the lake and killing the fish with the application of rotonone.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that due to the importance of Hawley Lake to the Tribe and its enterprises, that the amount of \$25,000.00 in the Tribal Budget for 1969-1970, Section IX Land Operations, E. Paradise Creek Lake be amended to provide these funds for the drainage of Hawley Lake and poisoning of the Shiners.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
