## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Lot No. A-49, Rosalie Johnson cabin located at Hondah and Lot No. B-214, Barry V. Giles cabin located at Hawley Lake have been destroyed by fire, and
- WHEREAS, Rosalie Johnson and Barry V. Giles are in arrears in rental payments and have refused to cleanup the area or reconstruct their cabins as provided in Article 13 of their leases, and
- WHEREAS, the Council desires that legal action be commenced against said parties.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Attorney is hereby directed to bring legal action against Rosalie Johnson and Barry V. Giles, for any and all damages suffered by the Tribe because of the destruction of said buildings and the failure of the lessee to comply with the covenants of the lease.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
