

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the tribal council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has recently granted a right of way to American Telephone and Telegraph Company to install a relay station on top of Cooley Mountain south of Hondah, and

WHEREAS, the American Telephone and Telegraph Company needs electric power to operate the relay station, and

WHEREAS, the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has applied for a right of way beginning south of the Hondah complex, near the old Cooley Ranch for a distance of 3000 feet to the American Telephone and Telegraph Company relay station.

BE IT RESOLVED that said right of way be granted to Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. in accordance with maps on file in the Superintendent's office, Fort Apache Indian Agency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way be granted gratuitously due to other considerations being granted to the tribe on the Sunrise Recreation Complex and other areas on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on December 11, 1969 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
