

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs proposes to construct, and pave a portion of Route 24 known as John F. Kennedy School Road, and

WHEREAS, said road serves the school as well as a considerable portion of the Cedar Creek residences.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted a gratuitous right-of-way approximately .43 miles in length and 60 feet in width pursuant to the map of definite location on file in the Superintendent's Office, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made and further that the stipulations in the GRANT OF EASEMENT be observed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency determine the necessary fencing and cattleguards along said route and construct or reconstruct and maintain same.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
