RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council acting in behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested construction of Route 8 known as Geronimo Trail, by Resolution No. 67-130, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs proposes to construct said road as soon as funds are provided, and
- WHEREAS, the map of definite location for a right-of-way 31.713 miles in length and 200 feet in width has been completed, and
- WHEREAS, the right-of-way requested is sufficient except where extremely high fills or cuts are encountered, in which case the construction may extend over the right-of-way line.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted a gratuitous right-of-way as shown on the map of definite location on file in the Superintendent's Office, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made and further that the Bureau of Indian Affairs shall have the right to transfer said right-of-way as set forth on page 6 of the GRANT OF EASEMENT to which reference is also hereby made. Revisions, shall be made to the map by the Bureau where high fills or cuts extend beyond the right-of-way line, after construction.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Fort Apache Agency determine the necessary fencing, cattleguards and construct or reconstruct the same.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
