

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Ord Creek Logging Unit is included in the five-year timber program, and

WHEREAS, the timber from this unit is part of the allowable annual cut.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Ord Creek Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's Report and Proposed Contract covering the recommended sale of this timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer, be sold to the Fort Apache Timber Company based on the ratio system. The rate charged for stumpage is to be adjusted monthly as specified in Tribal Resolution No. 69-103 and Area Director's Memorandum of August 22, 1969.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of the Timber for and on behalf of this council.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
