

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Pipkins have applied for a lease on a plot of land near their home in the Seven Mile Community, and

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Pipkins are retiring from their present positions within the near future and they desire to put in a feed store at this location, and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Pipkins is a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Mr. Pipkins has been a resident of the reservation for many years and is an honorary member of the Tribe.


BE IT RESOLVED that a gratuitous revocable permit be issued to Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Pipkins for a period of twenty-five (25) years on a plot of land described as follows:


A square plot of ground 208.7 feet east by west and 208.7 north by south, lying within the boundaries of the NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of section 31, T. 5 N., R. 23E. and located as follows:

Beginning at a closing corner of the Theodore Roosevelt Indian School survey; section 30 and 31, T. 5 N., R. 23 E. Thence southwest a distance of 646.3 feet to the southwest corner of the above plot. Said area contains 1.0 acre more or less.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Pipkins will not be required to obtain a traders license, unless she desires since she is a member of the Tribe and he is an honorary member, to operate a feed and seed store on the above described land.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
