RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 67-154 granted the United States Forest Service a gratuitous revocable permit and an easement covering a portion of the trail leading to Mount Baldy on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, when a search and remonumentation program was carried out during the summer of 1968 it was determined that the Mount Baldy Trail (East Fork Trail #195) crosses the reservation in one area which was not included in the original right-of-way application.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent and the Chairman are authorized and directed to approve an amendment to the original right-of-way application. Said amendment will cover approximately 455 feet, a map, plot and description of said land upon which the easement covers is on file in the Superintendent's Office, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on March 18, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
