## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has this date physically inspected the north boundary of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and observed the many cases of trespass that exist from the 45 mile corner to the 55 1/2 mile corner, and
- WHEREAS, the Council is definitely concerned about the problems associated with private encroachment onto the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Council is aware that the Bureau of Land Management has remonumented most corners and angle points of the north boundary during 1966, 1968 and 1969 and retracement of all remaining corners was was completed June 11, 1970.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby requests all assistance possible from the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Bureau of Land Management to expedite approval of the north boundary field notes from the 45 to the 55 1/2 mile corner, said field work having been performed during 1968 and 1969, and the recently completed retracement field notes for the same area of the north boundary, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is imperative that the White Mountain Apache Tribe make proper disposition of the existing trespass cases and avoid additional trespass problems and to do so it is essential that the field notes be obtained so that the boundary line can be accurately defined.

The foregoing resolution was on June 11, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
