RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the secondary manufacturing of wood products is the most likely approach for future economic development on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, one of the most likely means of developing this potential economic development is through the formation of a tribally-owned industrial park, and
- WHEREAS, grant funds are available for the construction of this type of project.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council make application to the appropriate federal agency for the necessary development funds.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, White Mountain Apache Tribe, be authorized to sign any and all documents required to develop this program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Sec. 1 (b & 1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
