RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the increased use of Fort Apache Reservation lands by the general public, wood cutters, loggers and others has put accelerated pressures on existing law enforcement agencies, and
- WHEREAS, the various livestock operators have expressed concern over the increased traffic on their ranges, and
- WHEREAS, it has been recommended that the Stockmen be commissioned as Tribal Officers.
- BE IT RESOLVED that all of the district Stockmen and such other personnel as may be designated by the Tribal Council be issued an identification card and be authorized to inspect persons, vehicles or camps on Reservation lands.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any violations encountered will be reported to the Tribal Wardens or Tribal Police for prosecution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 10, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
