RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it is the custom of the Tribal Council to accept recommendations from the Superintendent on long range development projects, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council now feels that some recommendations of the Superintendent have led to an unespectedly large outlay of tribal funds in certain projects now under construction, and
- WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the Tribal Council that the working relationship between the Tribal Council and the Superintendent has deteriorated considerably, and
- WHEREAS, a closer working relationship between the Superintendent and the Tribal Council is absolutely essential to the welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior of the United States is hereby requested to arrange an immediate transfer for the incumbent Superintendent.
- The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
