RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Forestry Committee recommended to the council that the said committee and the council should be kept completely informed regarding the expenditures of funds allocated to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Indian Agency and funds collected from the enterprises and from other purchasers of tribal timber in payment for penalty and waste scale and payment of scaling services furnished by the said technicians and financed by the tribe, and
- WHEREAS, council is of the opinion that this recommendation would result in a greater involvement by the tribe in the management of its resources.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Fort Apache Indian Agency is hereby requested to provide the Tribal Council a detailed monthly accounting of all funds collected from the Purchasers of timber in payment for penalty or waste scale and scaling services and how said funds were expended or allocated.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fort Apache Indian Agency furnish the Forestry Committee a monthly accounting of the such funds collected by the said Forestry Department and the results of the Agency in getting proper utilization of the forest resources in each operating area of the reservation and in particular where private enterprises are operating.

The foregoing resolution was on August 5, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 and 1 abstained by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
