

RESOLUTION OF THE  
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the timber to be sold on the Coulter Salvage Logging Unit is not a part of the allowable annual cut and does not affect that cut, and

WHEREAS, Fort Apache Timber Company has stated that they do not want the products coming from this salvage sale.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Coulter Salvage Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's Report and Proposed Contract covering the recommended sale of this timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer be advertised for sale by sealed bid at the following minimum rate per thousand board feet:

<u>Species</u>	<u>Estimated Volume in Board Feet</u>	<u>Recommended Minimum Stumpage Rate</u>
Ponderosa pine and all other species dead or down timber and including standing, green aspen sawlogs.	3,500,000	\$1.20/MBM
Mine props, all species dead or down timber, and including standing green aspen.	60,000 count	\$0.07 each

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of the timber for and on behalf of this council.

The foregoing resolution was on September 30, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
