

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Reservation Creek Beetle Control Logging Unit, Contract No. H50C-1420-7065 appears to be economically inoperable under the present market situation and timber sale contract specifications, and


WHEREAS, some of the economic problems can be alleviated through a modification of some contract specifications such as requiring the purchaser to log only green sawtimber, no stumpage charge for pulpwood should the purchaser elect to harvest it and no slash disposal requirements, and


WHEREAS, these modifications will meet the objectives being proposed for the spruce area.

BE IT RESOLVED that this logging unit contract be modified to enhance the economic prospectives yet remain within acceptable management objectives for the spruce area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the formal contract modification for and on behalf of this council.

The foregoing resolution was on September 30, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
