RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe owns and operates one of the finest recreation areas in the west, and
- WHEREAS, the cost of salaries and operating expenses continue to increase each year, and
- WHEREAS, the price of fishing, hunting and camping permits has not been increased for several years and more revenue is needed to properly manage the program, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors has recommended fee increases to become effective January 1, 1971.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the attached schedule of permit fees, recommended by the Board of Directors of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise be adopted.

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1970 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for, 3 abstained and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 1y of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
