

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, to further the overall economic development of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and to improve roads in the various communities, and

WHEREAS, the Roads Committee has thoroughly discussed the condition of the reservation roads and set up a schedule, and

WHEREAS, adequate roads are vital for the future economic and social development of the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by this resolution recommends to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Phoenix Area Office, the following priorities for road improvement on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation:

1972

Route 55 (3 miles) - - - - -	\$ 300,000
North Whiteriver Subdivision- - - - -	58,000
Carrizo Community (1 mile) - - - - -	88,783
Cibecue Streets - - - - -	187,674

1973

Enos Moody-Rock Creek - - - \$ 495,000 (4.5 miles)	Cibecue (6.1 miles)- - - \$ 635,407

1974

Cibecue-Grasshopper - - - 1,500,000 (15.0 miles)	Canyon Day (6.1 miles) - - - 636,000

18.0 miles - - - - - 1,700,000	8.0 miles- - - - - 800,000

21.0 miles - - - - - 2,100,000	10.0 miles - - - - - 1,000,000
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1977

24.0 miles - - - - - 2,400,000	12.0 miles - - - - - 1,200,000
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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the reservation and community roads should be improved by the Bureau of Indian Affairs at at total cost of \$21,326,407 which will include 85.5 of Economic Development and 45.1 miles of streets, approximately.
