

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads, has completed surveys covering road improvements in the Cibecue area, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has requested they be granted a road right-of-way.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency is hereby authorized to grant a gratuitous road right-of-way 50 feet in width, a distance of 0.085 miles and 100 feet in width, a distance of 2.968 miles, a total distance of 3.053 miles, located in Sections 1 and 12, T.7N., R.17E, and Sections 6,7,17 and 18, T.7N., R.18E. (Unsurveyed), G&SRB&M, Arizona, as shown on Map No. FA-3-1, which is on file in the Office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing resolution was on September 8, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
