

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the 1080 poison program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been very effective in the control of coyotes and other predatory animals, and

WHEREAS, this poison program has only been done on a six-month basis, and

WHEREAS, the Council recommended that poison program be continued over the entire reservation during the winters.

BE IT RESOLVED that permission is hereby granted to place 1000 poison over the entire reservation, under rules and regulations as followed in the past, during the winters.

The foregoing resolution was on September 21, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1953 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
