

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, at the October 27, 1971 meeting of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council and Health, Education and Welfare Committee, the establishment of the position of Education Coordinator was approved, and

WHEREAS, there are now many White Mountain Apache children in school and there is a definite need for a full time Education Coordinator to coordinate all Tribal Education programs, and

WHEREAS, the establishment of this position will, we believe, result in much closer cooperation between the Tribe and the Schools, and will give the Tribal Leaders, parents and communities a clearer understanding of our mutual problems, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that accurate records and follow-through in education of our Apache children be made and kept.

BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby established an Education Coordinator's position together with taxes and fringe benefits, to be employed by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Health, Education and Welfare Committee hereby is authorized to supervise the said Education Coordinator

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds for this said position be obtained from Buy Indian Act Contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Chairman is to seek the advice and guidance of Fred Banashley, Sr., Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, Barry DeRose, Tribal Attorney and Tim Dye, Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, in determining the choice of, and the need for an Education Coordinator.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
