

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, communication among the various elements and agencies working on the reservation continues as a major problem, and


WHEREAS, the presentation and expression of problems and ideas to the Apache people and to outside agencies needs improvement, and

WHEREAS, Mr. John Crouch of the Frederick Burk Foundation of San Francisco State College has presented a proposal whereas he and that foundation might provide equipment and personnel to establish a media program on the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has been informed of the proposed White Mountain Apache Media Project as presented by Mr. John Crouch on December 8, 1971 and the Tribal Council has given its full approval to the Media Project.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
