

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council and the Law and Order Committee have been receiving complaints regarding the behavior of minors and others in and near the Apache Flame, and

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Tribal Council that some of these complaints have been reported to the Superintendent of Arizona State Liquor Licenses and Control, and he is becoming quite perturbed about these reports, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that if corrective measures are not taken immediately, there is a possibility that some or all of the Fort Apache Development Corporation, Inc. liquor licenses could be cancelled, which would result in a great loss of income to the Corporation as well as employment opportunities for tribal members, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware that there is a dire need for better working relationships between the tribal police department, tribal court, parents, Fort Apache Development Corporation, Inc., and management in trying to solve these problems, and

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the White Mountain Apache Police Department is directed to fully cooperate with the Fort Apache Development Corporation, Inc. in seeing that the Apache Flame is properly policed by providing an off-duty policeman or recommending someone to work on weekends and holidays.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary of this employee shall be paid by the Fort Apache Development Corporation, Inc.

The foregoing resolution was on December 8, 1971 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
