

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Chediski Logging Unit is included in the five-year timber sale program, and

WHEREAS, timber from this unit is part of the allowable cut, and

WHEREAS, part of the timber on this unit has been damaged by wildfire.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chediski Logging Unit, as presented in the Forest Officer's Report, and proposed contract covering the recommended sale of timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer, be sold to the Fort Apache Timber Company, at the following minimum rate per thousand board feet:

<u>Species</u>	<u>MBM (Net)</u>	<u>Recommended Stumpage Rate</u>
Ponderosa pine and all other species	31,836	Rates in effect at time of payment for Fort Apache Timber Company

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that due to the wildfire, which swept through part of the sale area, that these burned areas shall be harvested first to reduce the loss of quality timber by deterioration.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute the contract and related documents, necessary to administer the sale of timber for and on behalf of this council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED a deduction not to exceed twenty-five per cent (25%) of the gross receipts received from the purchaser will be accrued in the road suspense account. This accrual will continue until the road suspense account is funded to the extent required to provide the road construction fund reserve authorized by the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
