

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Dr. Gary H. Spivey, U. S. Public Health Service recommended to the Tribal Council a proposal for a Tuberculosis Control Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Service is trying to alleviate and eradicate the tubercular problem, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that such a program would be beneficial to the health of the White Mountain Apaches.

BE IT RESOLVED that Dr. Spivey and the U. S. Public Health Service is hereby authorized to proceed a Tuberculosis Control Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the program provide that the Tribe, its officers and employees shall be fully insured and protected against any liability due to the operation of the program.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
