

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the townsite of Whiteriver is growing, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is concerned of the traffic problem and town safety,
and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary that adjustments be made in the location
of the townsite limits and speed control.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe
that the townsite limits be located on the south at mile post
338 at the cattle guard by the Apache Flame, and on the north
at mile post 340 by Raynor Gushoney's.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that within the town limits the speed shall be
posted at 25 m.p.h., 35 m.p.h. from North Whiteriver Sub-Division
and 50 m.p.h. and 50 m.p.h. from Diamond Creek Housing to North
Whiteriver Sub-Division.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1972 duly adopted by a vote
of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain
Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1
(i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the
Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
984).
