

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe enacted Ordinance No. 47 on January 13, 1963 establishing the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority in order to eliminate unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority desires to provide decent, safe and sanitary housing for families of low income through programs sponsored by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal members are still greatly in need of low-rent housing for the elderly and for general occupancy.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority is hereby authorized and directed to submit all necessary documents to the Department of Housing and Urban Development to effectuate the development of 65 dwelling units of Low-Rent Housing for the elderly and 35 dwelling units of Low-Rent for general occupancy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Housing Authority immediately make application for Community facilities, including but without limitations, Gymnasiums and community buildings in the area where the dwelling units are constructed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that first priority for the said community facilities be for the Cibecue area of the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
