

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise is charged with the responsibility of regulating hunting and fishing by non-members on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 1972, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors recommended a schedule on season and bag limits on elk hunting to the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors recommended the season dates as November 11, 1972 through November 19, 1972 for non-members; bag limit of (1) elk; any elk; either sex; 600 permits, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors also recommended the season dates as November 11, 1972 through November 26, 1972; bag limit of (1) elk; any elk; either sex.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that this recommendation recommended by the Board of Directors be approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Arizona State Game and Fish Department be notified that this be put in the T-Order that all hunters will be required to check in and out of the checking station. This station will be located at the Hon-Dah Junction of 173-73.

The foregoing resolution was on May 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
