

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 72-45 adopted on April 19, 1972 closed a portion of the Reservation to hunting, fishing, travel and camping, and


WHEREAS, the Reservation has received sufficient rainfall to eliminate the extreme fire danger, and


WHEREAS, the Branch of Forestry and the Manager of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise have recommended that this portion of the Reservation be reopened to fishing and camping.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the areas closed by Resolution No. 72-45 be reopened to fishing and camping.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if in the future should extreme fire conditions exist, the Chairman of the Forestry Committee is authorized to open or close portions of the Reservation to camping and other recreational activities, after consultation and approval of the Recreation Enterprise Manager and the Branch of Forestry.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
