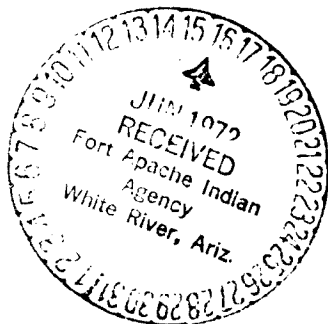


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe to operate the Tribal Law and Order Program, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe has had a meeting and discussed its desire with the Superintendent, Area Director, Area Special Officer, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe assumes the responsibility of the operation of the Police Program, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs will maintain the Office of Criminal Investigation and the investigation of crime, and training, technical assistance and inspection, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council accept this responsibility as soon as arrangements can be made and fulfill their desires to employ a Tribal Chief of Police and assistance.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that it will operate the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department and continue to cooperate with the Agency with complete, full jurisdiction and enforce their prevention program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 8, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
