

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe owns and operates the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise, a Tribal Enterprise, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise Board of Directors recommends that Christmas Tree Lake be established as a walk-in-Lake, and

WHEREAS, this lake would provide one variety of fish which is in accord with the fish management program, and

WHEREAS, for non-members:

Season Dates: September 1 and close September 30, 1972.

Limit : Three (3) fish per adult per day.
One fish per child per day. (14 years and under)

Gear : Lures and flies only (No Bait)

Hours : 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Option : To close lake if harvest is too great.

Publicity : Local, the rationale being that a large number of fishermen would be undesirable on Christmas Tree Lake at the low fee being charged. It was the Recreation Board recommendation to leave fees as established for 1972,

and

WHEREAS, for Tribal Members:

Season Dates: September 1 and close September 30, 1972.

Limit : Five (5) fish per member.

Gear : Lures and flies only (No Bait)

Hours : 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

No littering - Each person carry out own litter - Violators will be prosecuted.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the recommendations set forth on Christmas Tree Lake be adopted for the year 1972.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
