

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, trespassing of livestock in the McNary Area has become a major problem both to the residents of McNary and to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 31 has been in effect for some time covering such trespass, and

WHEREAS, the enforcement of this Ordinance will require the combined efforts of Galbraith, Southwest Forest Industries and the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that Paul E. Amos, Jr. and Steven Lupe, as Tribal Representatives, be sent to McNary to work out an agreement with Southwest Forest Industries for the enforcement of Ordinance No. 31; whereby, all rrespasing livestock on the McNary side of the division fence will be impounded by Southwest Forest Industries and all trespassing livestock on the Tribal side of the division fence will be impounded by the Tribal Respresentatives listed above and/or their aides.

The foregoing resolution was on August 4, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
