

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Highway Department has requested a 200 foot right-of-way from Indian Pine to Coal Mine Canyon, and

WHEREAS, as the Council felt that the present 100 foot right-of-way is adequate, and

WHEREAS, the Council request that the Arizona State Highway representatives come before the council and discuss their programming and future needs, and

WHEREAS, the present right-of-way appears to be adequate from Indian Pine to Coal Mine Canyon.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that at the present time, it does not grant the 200 foot right-of-way as requested.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that additional consideration will be given at future dates if the Arizona Highway Department furnishes adequate justification.

The foregoing resolution was on October 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of June 18, 1934 Act (Stat. 984).
