

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the tribe desires to take over the Law Enforcement function of the Police Force on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the tribe feels that it has no qualified members to accept the job of Chief of Police, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Raymond F. Dahm has had experience with law enforcement for a number of years and is considered by the tribe to be well-qualified.

BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Raymond F. Dahm be hired as Chief of Police and that a contract and operating procedures be drawn up to the satisfaction of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on October 3, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
