

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, many loans have been made to individual Tribal members from tribal funds, and

WHEREAS, in a number of cases, little or no effort has been made by the Tribal member recipients of these loans to repay them, and

WHEREAS, sporadic efforts have been made by the Tribal Business Office to encourage the recipients to repay these loans to no avail.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council create the salaried position of Collector, to work full time on collecting tribal fund deficiencies from delinquent Tribal Members, and take action to collect on bad checks received by Tribal Enterprises.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this man should be bonded and have the authority of the Tribal Court to issue citations in extreme cases.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a man to fill this position will be selected by, and his work directed and supervised by the Tribal Advisory Committee.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
