

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there are many low-income people on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in the vicinity of Whiteriver, and

WHEREAS, most of these people lack transportation in order to take advantage of lower prices at Shopping Centers off the reservation and are forced to make all purchases of necessities at the higher priced Trading Posts on the reservation, and

WHEREAS, if a discount Super Market were available to these low-income people in Whiteriver, they would not only gain in being able to purchase more for their dollars, but would eventually learn to pay cash and avoid the necessity of credit at higher priced Trading Posts.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe make every effort to encourage a discount Super Market, such as FEDMART, to open a market at Whiteriver.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1972 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
