

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has requested permission to construct a 2.3/4.16 powerline to serve eleven homes in the Upper East Fork area, and

WHEREAS, these eleven homes are owned and occupied by tribal members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent is hereby authorized to grant a right-of-way approximately 1.027 miles in length and 20 feet wide to the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc., pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, for a period of not to exceed fifty years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. shall reseed all areas where vegetation is destroyed by the construction of or the use of said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way agreement provide that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. shall repair and maintain all fences which might be damaged due to the maintenance of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results that will ensue by the construction of the powerline with the exception of repair of fences and the reseeding of lands which may be damaged by the construction or use of said right-of-way.

The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
