

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to express their gratitude to Governor Williams of the State of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, through the efforts of the Governor's Office, the Office of Employment Security Commission was established on the reservation at Whiteriver, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the benefits from this office to the White Mountain Apache people has been great in securing employment and assistance through this office, and

WHEREAS, there is a sincere feeling of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that this office be retained and furnished on the reservation and that the White Mountain Apache people will continue to receive many benefits, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache people and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council wishes to thank the Governor of the State and this office for the many considerations received.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that we request the Governor of the State of Arizona and the Office of Employment Security Commission to maintain this office for the benefit of the White Mountain Apache people and all of our non-Indian neighbors in the surrounding community.

The foregoing resolution was on January 22, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
