

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it would be a good business practice to recognize facsimile signatures to covering checks written on The First National Bank of Arizona, said checks being written by the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED that the First National Bank of Arizona, as a designated depository of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be, and it is hereby requested, authorized and directed to honor checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money drawn in the White Mountain Apache Tribe's name, including those drawn to the individual order of those persons whose names appear thereon as signer or signers thereof, when bearing or purporting to bear the facsimile signatures of any of the following:

and the First National Bank of Arizona shall be entitled to honor and to charge the White Mountain Apache Tribe for all such checks, drafts or other orders, regardless of by whom or by what means the facsimile signature or signatures thereon may have been affixed thereto, if such facsimile signature or signatures resemble the facsimile specimens duly certified to or filed with the First National Bank of Arizona by the Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall remain in full force and effect until written notice of the revocation thereof shall have been delivered to and received by said bank.

The foregoing resolution was on February 20, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
