

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, inclement weather has curtailed logging operations on the timber sale units under contract to Fort Apache Timber Company, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company Sawmill at Whiteriver have ceased operation due to the lack of logs, and

WHEREAS, Fort Apache Timber Company has requested that the west and north boundaries of the Big Canyon Timber Sale be extended to include middle Cedar Creek and the West Fork of middle Cedar Creek starting at Bear Springs and thence north to Faught Ridge, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to extend these boundaries to allow the Fort Apache Timber Company to log this timber and thus get the sawmill back in operation.

BE IT RESOLVED that it is hereby stipulated and agreed that the boundary of Big Canyon Logging Unit be changed to include the above-described area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that except as herein modified, the remainder of the aforesaid contract shall remain in full force and effect and binding upon the parties thereto as though no modification had been made.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1973 duly adopted by anvote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
