

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, in the Tribal Economic Development Program, the Tribe has received difficulties in getting adequate construction and inspection, and

WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the Tribal Council and involved Board of Directors that it is necessary to have adequate inspection to assure the Tribe of good quality work and workmanship.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the previous Inspector, Mr. Al Roggie be replaced by Mr. Phil Huck.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Huck be assigned to the position until the Sunrise construction is completed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe has appreciated the efforts of the Bureau of Indian Affairs for supplying Mr. Al Roggie as an Inspector.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to commend Mr. Roggie on his work and attitudes and express its sincere thanks to Mr. Roggie for his efforts.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
