

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Raymond Endfield, Jr. is an enrolled member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Endfield is attending the Arizona State University Law School, and

WHEREAS, he will have completed, at the end of this semester, one full year of law school, and

WHEREAS, he is highly recommended by the professors of the Law School for summer employment, and

WHEREAS, this summer employment would further his educational experiences and be of benefit to the White Mountain Apache Tribe as well as additional assistance to the Tribal Attorney.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the Tribal Attorney is permitted to hire Mr. Raymond Endfield, Jr. for summer employment at a rate agreeable to the Tribal Attorney and Mr. Endfield.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council is proud of their own people who make these endeavors and wish to congratulate Mr. Endfield on his success.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribe understands that Mr. Endfield will spend approximately ninety per cent (90%) of his summer employment on the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
