

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has received an invitation to make a proposal for the Pilot Bureau of Indian Affairs Parent Child Development Program for Fiscal Year 1973-1974, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council felt that they are ill-prepared to review this invitation because of the limited time allowed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to enter into this type of contract, but must be granted additional time for consideration and studies.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it desires to submit a proposal to enter into the Pilot Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribe also request an extension of thirty (30) days on the time for submission of the proposal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe pleads with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to program this type of opportunity well enough in advance to permit the Tribe to make adequate studies of all the proposals in its impact upon the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on March 8, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (j) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
