

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has discussed many times the financial condition of the Central Tribe and Enterprises, and

WHEREAS, each year the cash reserve becomes less and less, and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 1973-74 budget, the Central Tribe budgeted for a \$211,000.00 savings in that fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, Sunrise Enterprise budgets for fiscal year 1973-74 are deficit budgets for operation of the Sunrise Complex and Capital improvement, and

WHEREAS, the Central Tribe cannot support these enterprises from cash reserves but must either make a loan or additional capital investment.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman be given full authority to make the necessary arrangements to secure funds to permit all or part of planned budgeted expenditures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if investments in other enterprises can be returned to the Central Tribe these funds be used.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when action is taken the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe will amend the necessary budget or budgets to reflect that action.

The foregoing resolution was on April 4, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
